Dear audience,

The last year forced us to slow down, but it also gave us a chance to reflect on our practices in the contemporary art field. We strive to find more sustainable ways of creating, touring, and innovating – both in creative processes and encounters with audiences. How can we share our practices, our humanistic and artistic values with audiences?

We are engaged in a long-term collaboration with choreographer Eszter Salamon that allows us to dive deeper into research and meet audiences with a plurality of forms. Salamon creates uncompromising works that explore contemporary issues. Her works combine strong political statements with an incredibly sensitive dimension. Salamon's first creation in March 2022 is a large-scale piece for the 14 dancers of Carte Blanche, which will explore landscapes of bodies in motion, voices, and costumes in a monochrome environment.

For the second premiere in May 2022, Carte Blanche will meet two young and talented artists: Roza Moshtaghi from Norway and Lander Patrick from Portugal, for a double bill titled *mellomland*. Choreographer Roza Moshtaghi proposes a piece shaped like a poem, experimenting with the state of waiting, a condition that postpones or constantly cancels the future.

Choreographer Lander Patrick wishes to awaken our senses about injustice perpetrated throughout history. Obsessed and inspired by the strategic and warlike chess game, he creates a hypnotic symphony of images and sound, exploring virtuosity, rhythms, sharp and crisp movements, as well as embodying grotesque and dramatic patterns. *mellomland* is an exciting evening of two distinct artistic approaches by the same generation of artists.

As a repertoire company, we are delighted to continue to perform previous creations: the successful pieces *Nororoca* by the Brazilian choreographer Lia Rodrigues and *But Then, We'll Disappear (I'd Prefer Not To)* by multidisciplinary artist Frédérick Gravel. We are looking forward to starting a new process with two Sami artists in fall 2022. The company will meet choreographer Elle Sofe Sara and visual artist Joar Nango to create the piece titled *BIRGET; Ways to deal, ways to heal.*

The company will pursue its touring in Norway and abroad. Our strong desire is to create more meetings with audiences and local communities. We provide workshops and discursive opportunities and wish to collaborate actively with each venue to further audience development. We believe in the importance of extending the experience of the art forms beyond the performances, and we are happy to engage our skills and human resources to make it happen.

BUD by Roza Moshtaghi

The starting point for *BUD* is "waiting", and in the performance choreographer Roza Moshtaghi explores how we can experience a story about "waiting" and expectations associated with being in this mysterious state.

The performers go through different scenarios of waiting, stopping and suspending. The enigmatic figures are dressed in costumes that borders on installations, making *BUD*'s scenic waiting room a strong visual experience with five of the company's dancers.

Sovaco de Cobra by Lander Patrick

In Sovaco de Cobra (English: The Snake's Armpit) by Lander Patrick, we are invited into a world where social rules must give way to the rules of a game.

Using the angle of chess – informed by his fascination with the duality of this strategic and warlike game – Patrick creates an energetic performance where new rules emerge, and the pieces of the game are challenged.

Sovaco de Cobra is made for nine of Carte Blanche's dancers who throw themselves into the game with warmth and vitality. The performance is full of virtuosity, and sharp and crisp movements; and the dancers orient themselves in a whirlwind of rhythms, tempo, and playfulness.

MONUMENT 0.10: THE LIVING MONUMENT creates a world based on colour and slowed movement.

In a magnificent scenography the audience is taken on a meditative journey through vibrant tableaus in a dreamlike universe where time almost stands still. *The Living Monument* invites the audience to slow down and immerse themselves in the sensory impressions and figures that appear in the endless landscapes on the scene.

In the performance, the theatrical elements are equal and interdependent, and it develops into an installation of sound, movement and figures. The landscapes on stage makes a space for sensing and wonder, and the slow transitions between colours, grand scenography and detailed costumes make for a strong and unique visual experience.

BUT THEN, WE'LL DISAPPEAR

A key element of *But Then*, *We'll Disappear (I'd Prefer Not To)* is the meeting between people and issues relating to the individual, "I" and their place in the group, "we". It questions how we meet other people – and how difficult it can be to find one's place in a community.

The dancers are already on the stage as the audience take their seats. They move seemingly unaffected by their surroundings. The costume design ensures that each dancer stands out from the crowd. Suddenly the choreography begins, and dance and music fill the space.

The dance and movements become more intense in step with the music. The dancers perform actions that are never completed. Interruptions and repetitions make the bodies jerk and twist – as if they are dancing to lines of songs only they can hear.

The stage is rearranged using lighting, sound, costumes and scenography. The nature of the choreography changes. A carpet is rolled out, the dancers gather on the sofa, and the microphone is switched on.

Carte Blanche meets the prominent choreographer Lia Rodrigues in the performance *Nororoca* – an exciting cultural exchange between Brazil and the Nordic countries.

In her hometown of Rio de Janeiro, award-winning Brazilian choreographer Lia Rodrigues has built her own company and cultural center located in the Maré favela. The dancers traveled to Brazil to work with Rodrigues in her studio, in the middle of one of the world's largest slums.

The title *Nororoca* is directly inspired by Rodrigues' performance *Pororoca* from 2009.

The word pororoca originates from the Tupian language: *poro'rog* – a powerful tidal phenomenon that occurs where saltwater and freshwater meet in the Amazon estuary.

Lia Rodrigues often uses art to express opinions. In *Nororoca* Rodrigues and Carte Blanche tread new choreographic footsteps that extend far beyond the stage.
